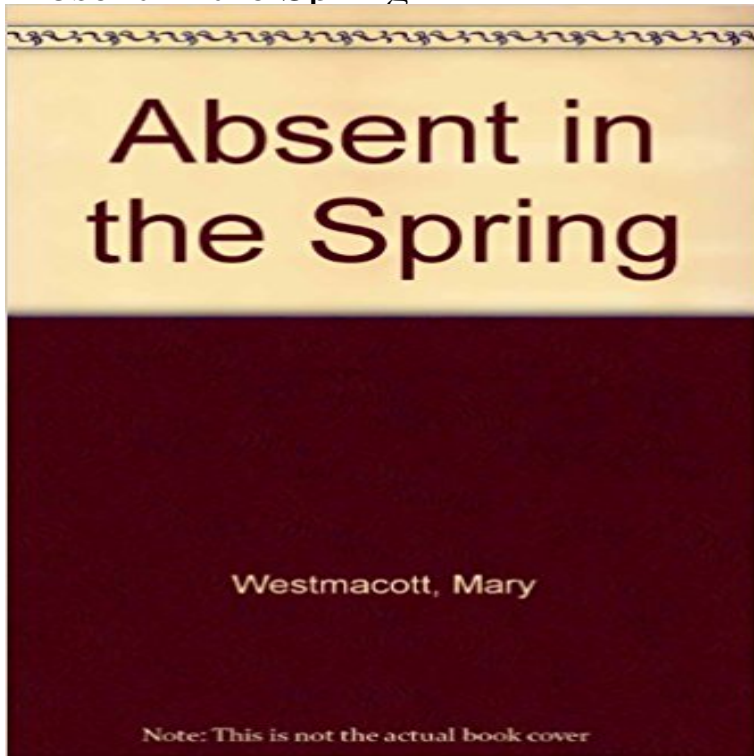


Absent in the Spring
