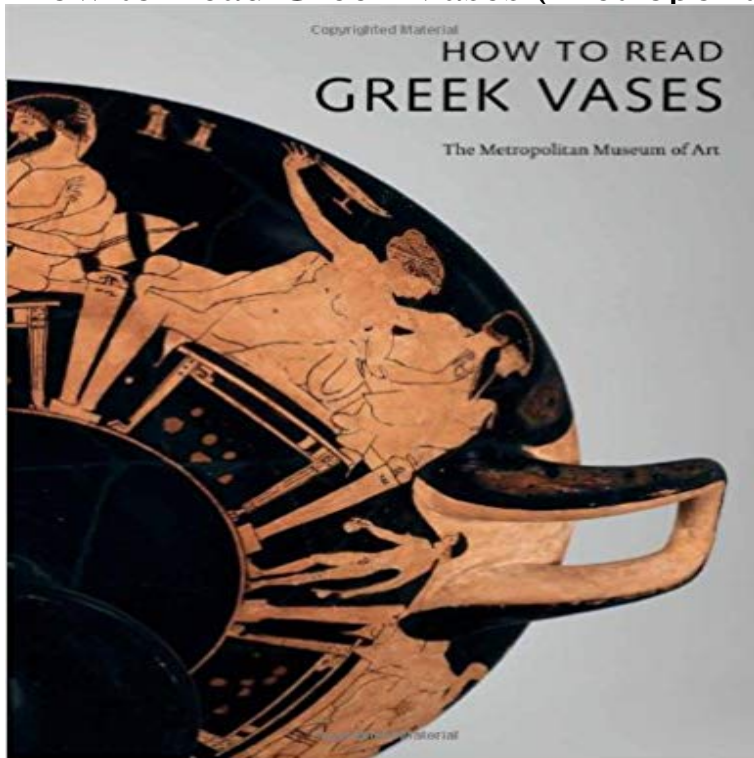


How to Read Greek Vases (Metropolitan Museum of Art)
