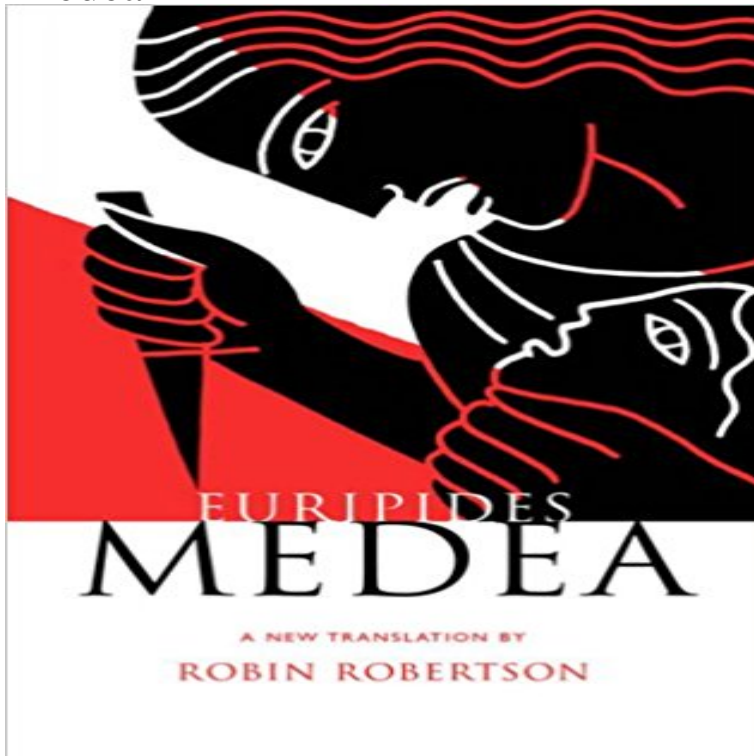


Medea
