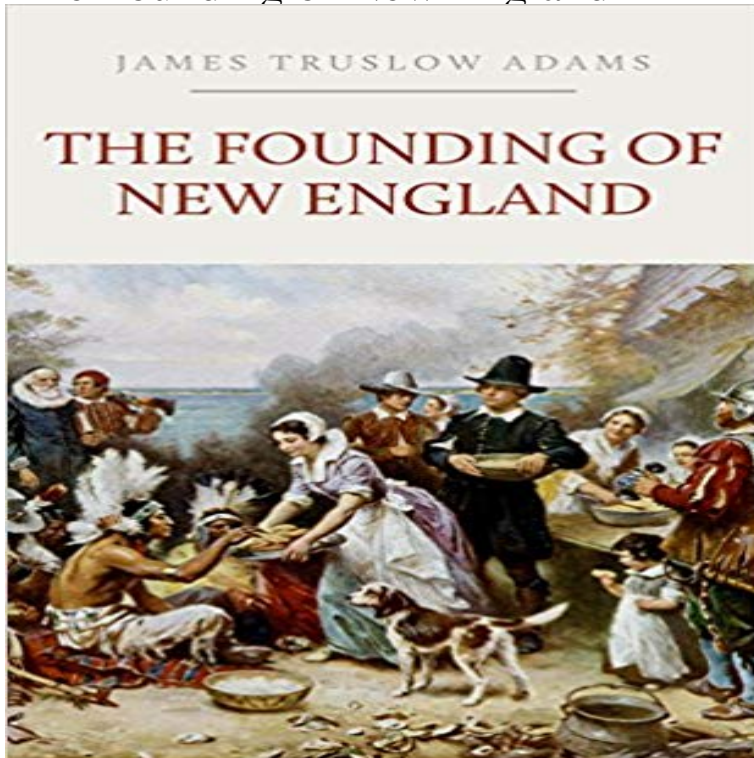


The Founding of New England



The following account of the founding of New England is intended to serve as an introduction to the later history of that section, and to the study of its relations with other portions of the Empire and with the mother-country, as well as of the sections influence upon the nation formed from such of the colonies as subsequently revolted.
