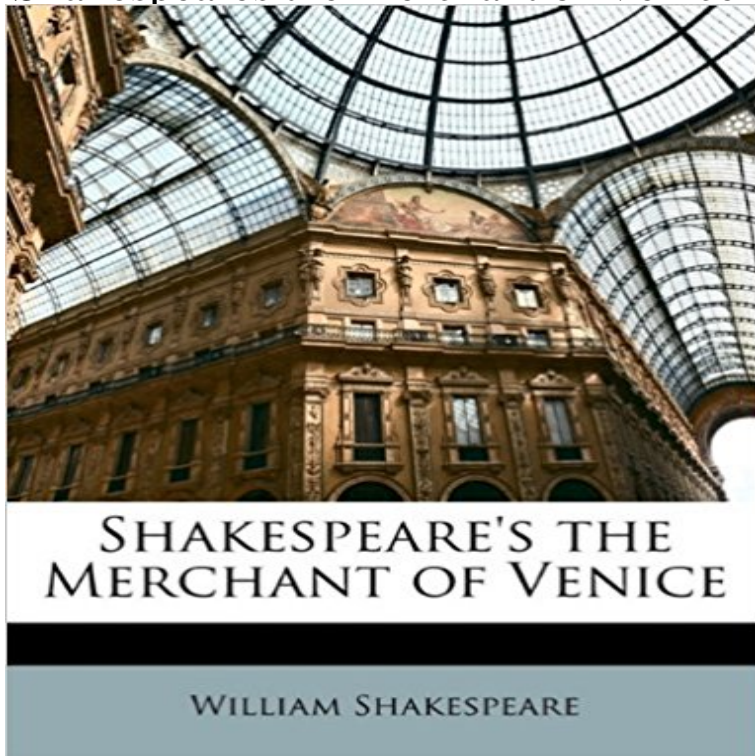


## Shakespeares the Merchant of Venice
