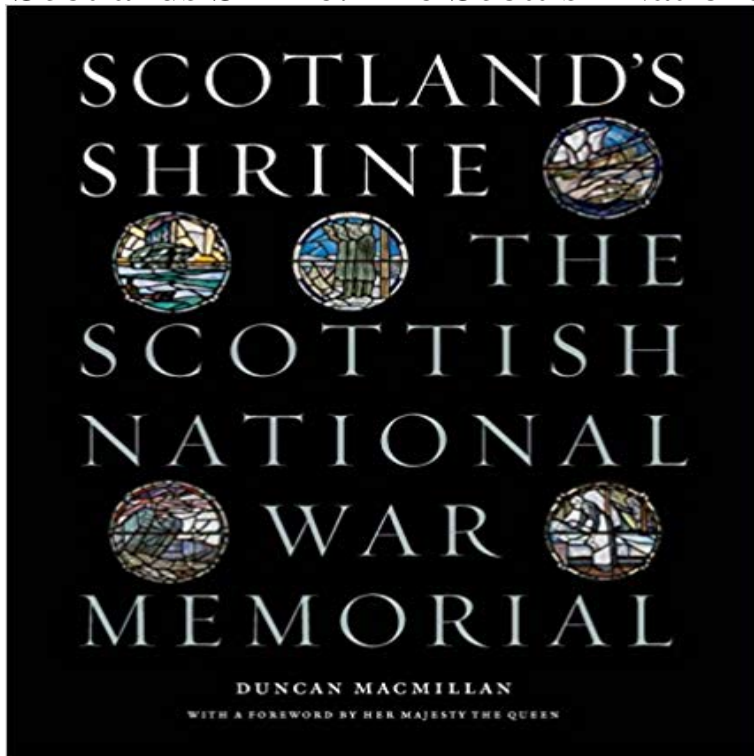


## Scotlands Shrine: The Scottish National War Memorial
