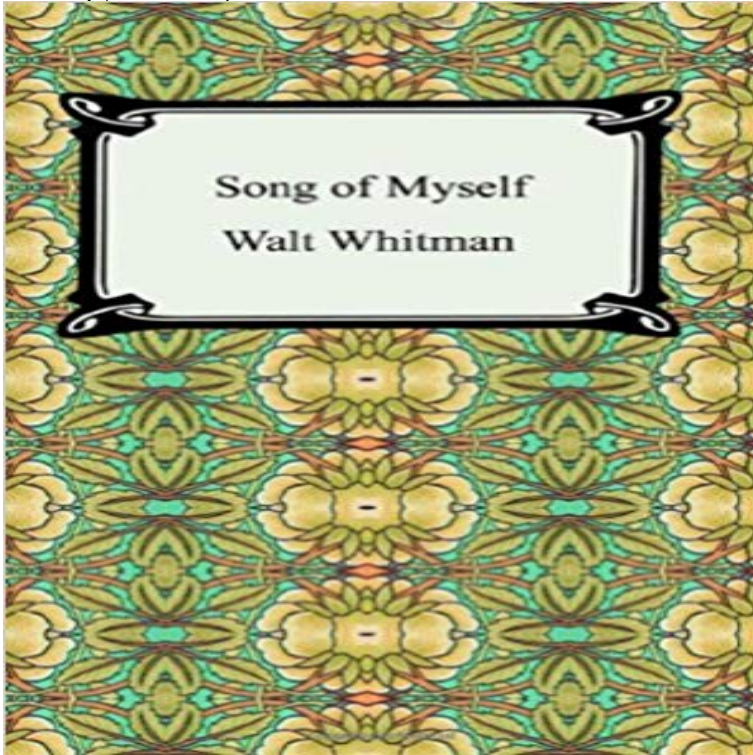


Song of Myself
