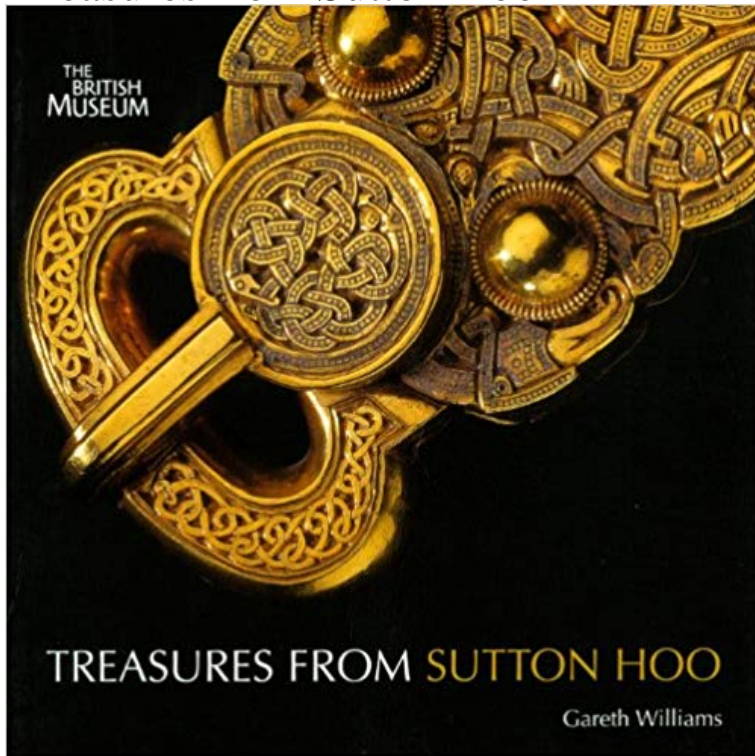


Treasures from Sutton Hoo
