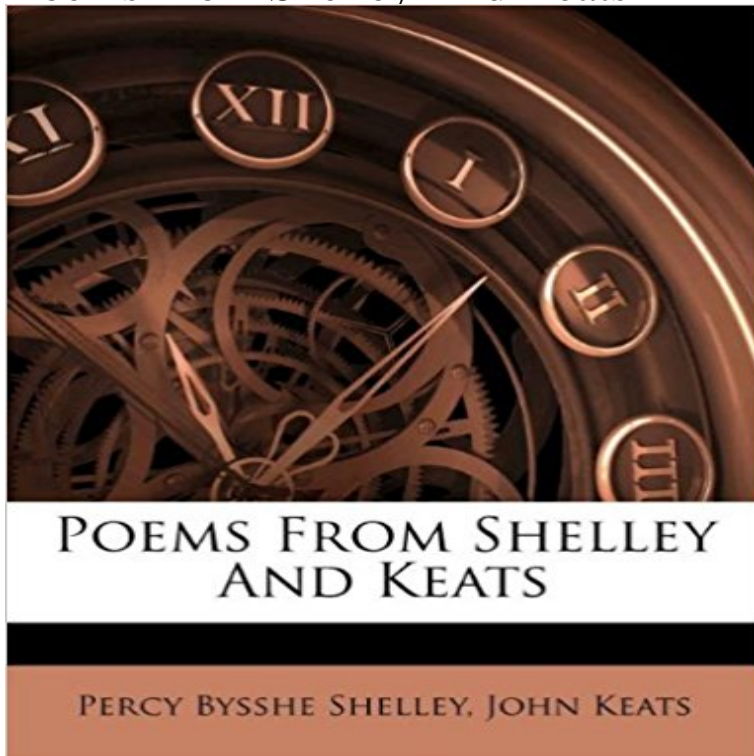


Poems From Shelley And Keats
