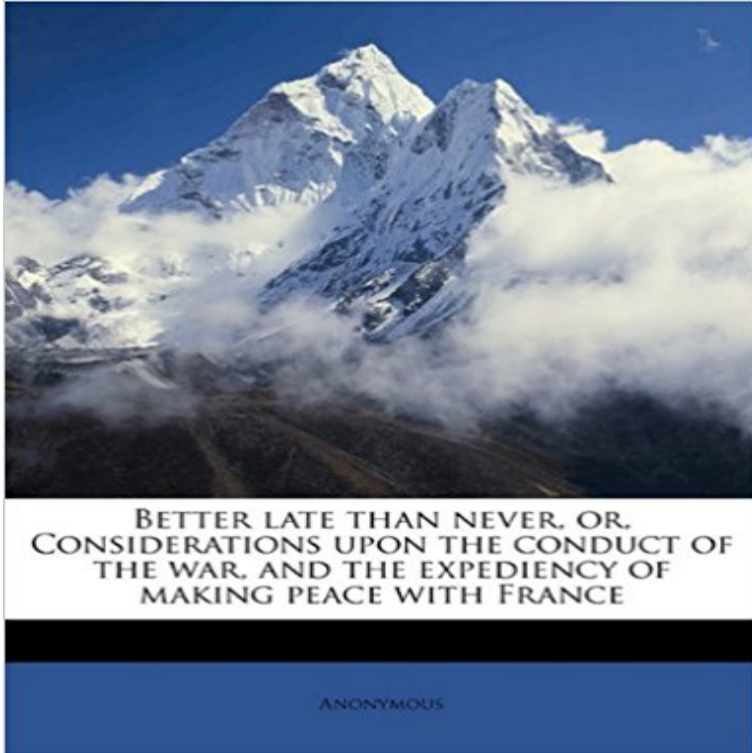


Better late than never, or, Considerations upon the conduct of the war, and the expediency of making peace with France
